Workshop on Prevention of Child Marriage
in the West Bank

As part of the UNRWA West Bank Field Office (WBFO) initiative to work on addressing child marriage, a workshop was held in October with the aim of analyzing, understanding and addressing the topic. It focused on the causes and consequences of child marriage, in addition to understanding the services to be offered in response. The workshop engaged staff on the role of front-line staff in efforts to mitigate the cases of child marriage.

It also looked at ways to address the issue by looking into contributing factors, such as gender roles, family and society norms. The need for a national plan to look into the issue from a broader, more holistic perspective and to explore the ways in which child marriage is linked to poverty was also analyzed.

Multisectoral coordination in UNRWA is henceforth needed in order to address the different facets of the issues that give rise to child marriage. Coordination will thus bring together protection, education, health, and Relief and Social Services. Participants agreed on an action plan for each sector, in addition to recognizing the important role to be played by community-based organizations.

In the same vein, UNRWA WBFO has worked on a series of films addressing child marriage from the poverty, education and health perspectives, which will be screened in Amman and WBFO as part of the 16 Days of Activism against GBV Campaign.

Launch of Manual for Community Workers
on Addressing GBV

UNRWA Lebanon Field Office (LFO), in partnership with Heartland Alliance International, has recently concluded the development of the manual, '[Community Workers' Guide to Understanding Gender-Based Violence and Child Protection Basic Concepts](#)'. The manual was the result of a training and capacity-building project implemented with Heartland International in 2015/16, which supported eight women programme centres in Palestine refugee camps in Lebanon.

The main aim of the manual is to strengthen community-based responses to better understand and address refugees' protection needs by building the capacity of community workers and volunteers. It is also designed to strengthen key skills in the safe identification and referral of survivors and individuals at risk, as well as basic skills and core guiding principles for primary psychosocial support.

Given the importance of community-based organizations as advocates and agents for change in their communities, the manual includes specific components on community-based GBV and child protection awareness and prevention programming in non-specialized settings, including the setup of community-based support groups for women at risk.

Inspiring Story

Green Cake

The ongoing blockade on Gaza and the recurring conflicts have prevented communities from developing their city and rebuilding houses and structures destroyed during the conflicts due to the restrictions on the entry of building materials.

Majd Almashharawi and Rawan Abdellatif, two young female civil engineers in Gaza, have started the *Green Cake* project, an environmentally friendly method of making bricks from coal ashes and cement. These bricks are produced at a cost of 25 per cent less than the commonly used ones. In addition, these bricks are also high quality.

The two engineers are currently looking into securing a patent and starting a production line. [Read more](#)

Iraq

Duhouk Survivor's Centre, established by UNFPA and the Iraqi Directorate General of Health last year, continues to provide specialized services to survivors of all forms of GBV. Since its opening, the Centre has handled over 850 cases, providing medical treatment, counselling, legal services and referrals to other services. [Read more](#)
