

## Preliminary Damage Assessment in Dera'a Camp

UNRWA was granted authorization to conduct a preliminary technical assessment in Dera'a camp in late October and early November 2018. The assessment revealed a great deal of destruction among UNRWA premises, including three schools and one health centre. About 400 Palestine refugee families have returned to the camp, and the number keeps increasing, even though basic infrastructure is not fully recovered. UNRWA is in the process of developing a plan to restore services in the camp; however the plan remains contingent on the rehabilitation of public infrastructure and the establishment of safe conditions including the clearance of ERW.

## NFI

### FOOD, NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFI) & SHELTER:

A total of 193,266 Palestine refugees received food parcels through the third round of emergency food distribution; in addition 7,983 refugees displaced from Yarmouk received ready-to-eat food baskets in Yalda during the same period. UNRWA also distributed 998 essential NFIs (mats, mattresses, blankets, Jerry cans, and kitchen kits) to Palestine refugees in Aleppo and Homs.

## CASH ASSISTANCE

### CASH ASSISTANCE:

In November, 114,947 Palestine refugees received emergency cash assistance through the third round of distribution, launched on 7 October 2018.

- 6 rounds of cash planned in the UNRWA Emergency Appeal
- 3 rounds actually conducted in 2018

## WASH

### WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH):

UNRWA provided Palestine refugees, particularly those displaced from Yarmouk and Dera'a, with 6,979 items of WASH assistance (hygiene kits, and diapers).

- 2,465 hygiene kits
- 4,514 baby and adult diapers

## HEALTH

### HEALTH:

69,595 health consultations were provided to Palestine refugee patients at 22 UNRWA health facilities across Syria, in addition to two mobile clinics, which were deployed to Yalda three times per week and to Ein el Tal camp in Aleppo.

- 40,559 female consultations
- 29,036 male consultations

## EDUCATION

### EDUCATION:

A total of 50,339 students (25,512 Male, 24,887 Female) from grades 1 to 9 are registered in 103 UNRWA-run schools across Syria.

- 103 schools | 50,399 students
- 24,887 girls
- 25,512 boys

## PROTECTION

### PROTECTION:

UNRWA focused on activities to enhance disability rights and inclusion. About 40 staff members were trained on disability inclusion in Damascus and Latakia; over 15 PSS activities for adults and children with disabilities and their care providers were conducted in Aleppo, Hama, and Latakia; and physiotherapy and rehabilitation services were re-established in Sbeineh camp.

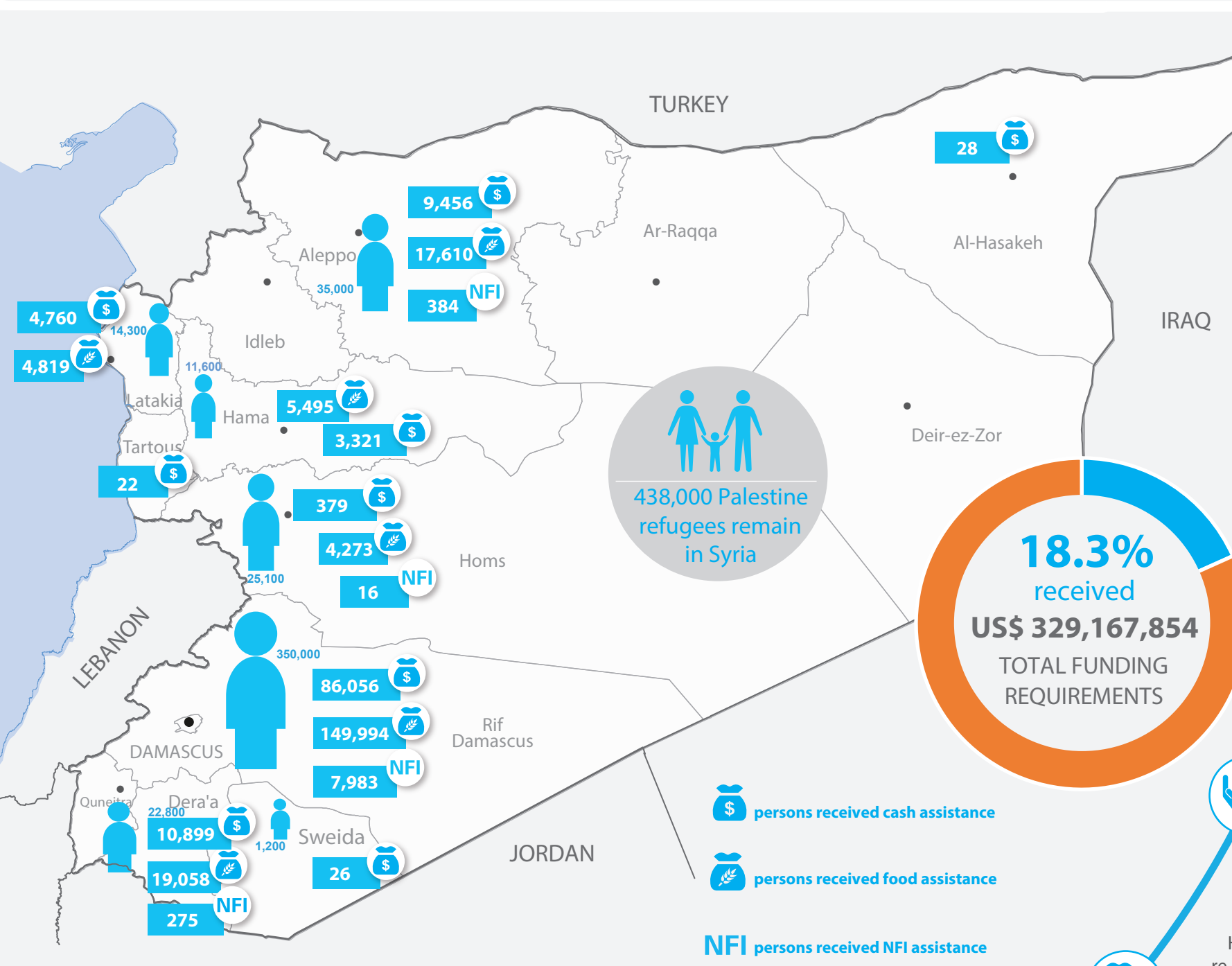

## LIVELIHOODS (MICROFINANCE):

### LIVELIHOODS (MICROFINANCE):

1,021 loans (388 females and 633 males) were provided by the Microfinance Department benefiting up to 3,472 Palestine refugees and Syrians. Meanwhile, 794 students were enrolled in short-term vocational training courses in Damascus, Homs, Latakia, and Aleppo.

- 1,021 microfinance loans
- 38% women
- 794 students enrolled in TVET
- 58% women
